EXHIBITION OVERVIEW

Illustrator Jessica Gadra creates intricate drawings of beloved stories, transforming the written word into elaborate visual images. From the whimsical world of fairy tales to the dark depths of mythology, she channels these timeless narratives to explore and comment on human nature.

Gadra's artwork captures the joy of escaping into magical worlds full of fairies, gnomes, and other fantastical beings. In the margins of her visual fables, she hides smaller stories that support or subvert the meanings of the traditional story.

Her drawings of harsh, vengeful lines in a wizard's face and the unblinking gaze of a goddess warn viewers about unchecked desire. Gadra's depiction of animals, mortals, and gods in conversation highlight the importance of wit, cunning, and most of all—patience.

Jessica Gadra: Fact in Fantasy is a powerful reminder of the authentic emotions and experiences at the core of fairy tales, myths, and other magical stories. Through her vivid illustrations, Gadra breathes new life into ancient tales that explore our shared hopes and fears.

MEET THE ARTIST

Jessica Gadra is a Buffalo-based illustrator who graduated from Canisius College (1998) with a BA in English. This debut exhibition of her work celebrates her lifelong passion for storytelling and art. Her illustrations have been featured in children's books, posters, shops, and galleries.

Gadra has been a longtime participant in numerous art festivals throughout Western New York including the Allentown Art Festival, the Elmwood Art Festival, the Lewiston Art Festival, and The Roycroft Campus.

She has illustrated over a dozen books including *Top Leaf* (2017) and *Grumpius* (2022), and is currently working on a piece called *The Labors of Herculania*. This work re-imagines the Greek story, *The Trials of Hercules*, through the day-to-day accomplishments of an elderly woman navigating and overcoming hardships in modern times.
